International Badge Day Celebration Ideas

Online

- Join the International Badge Day event on Facebook. <u>RSVP to the event</u> and share the event from your account or your College Panhellenic or Alumnae Panhellenic Facebook page. Ask your member chapters to post on their pages, too.
- Post the International Badge Day logo (<u>download from npcwomen.org</u>) on your Panhellenic website, and ask your member chapters to post on their pages.
- Change your profile picture on March 7, 2022, to a photo of your sorority's badge or of you wearing your badge.
- Change your status on Facebook on March 7, 2022, to read, "#IWearABadge today to celebrate the sorority experience with members worldwide."
- Post a photo of your badge day celebration event on the International Badge Day Facebook event page.
- Share your photos, celebrations and thoughts about International Badge Day on Twitter, Instagram and other social networks by marking your posts with #BadgeDay22. Tag @NPCWomen for an opportunity to be featured on NPC's social media.
- Share your sorority story using #BadgeDay22 on Instagram, Twitter and Facebook.
- Feature stories of sorority women who have made history in your community or from your campus using #IWearABadge and #BadgeDay22.

In Person

- Wear your badge with pride all day.
- Invite members of NPHC, NALFO, NAPA and NMGC organizations to join you in planning a celebration event on your campus or in your community.
- Host an information booth at your campus student union.
- Plan to wear your badge in the workplace and invite your sorority colleagues to lunch.
- Host a regional/local Alumnae or College Panhellenic luncheon and discuss your sorority history and the ideals upon which your founders built your organization.
- Select a philanthropy in your community and donate sorority service hours to that cause.
- Honor distinguished alumnae from your organization with a luncheon or dinner event.
- Use "Wear Your Letters on Your Heart" as a recruitment theme.

Media

- Organize leaders of your Alumnae and College Panhellenics to ask your governor or your state legislature to pass a proclamation or resolution recognizing March 7, 2022, as Panhellenic or Sisterhood Day.
- Ask your mayor to pronounce March 7, 2022, as Panhellenic or Sisterhood Day in your city.
- If you have a public International Badge Day event, send a news release or media alert to the local campus newspaper and/or your community newspaper.
- For quick media updates, consider sending a "Fast Facts" sheet to your favorite reporter or editor.

Contacting the Media

- 1. Contact your local or college newspaper by phone first and ask who the appropriate contact is to receive the information.
- 2. Send the news release or media alert by email to the appropriate contact.
- 3. Check the local or college newspaper's website to see whether you can submit the information directly via an events calendar form or news release form.
