College Panhellenic trends and statistics

Panhellenic excellence remains a high priority for the National Panhellenic Conference, and one of our objectives is to provide campus partners, including fraternity/sorority advisors, with Panhellenic knowledge. This month we are highlighting statistics that will enlighten FSAs as to what an “average” College Panhellenic looks like and what the overall trends were for the past year. It is our hope this data can assist you and your College Panhellenic as a benchmark in your work for the coming academic year.

The data we are providing comes from the 456 College Panhellenic annual reports received by June 25, from Release Figure Methodology reports, additional data gathered by the RFM Team and the NPC Extension Committee. There is at least one NPC sorority on more than 670 campuses throughout the United States and Canada. Currently, College Panhellenics are on 580 campuses having two or more NPC chapters.

- The average number of NPC chapters in College Panhellenic communities is six. Indiana University has the most NPC chapters at 22.
- The average College Panhellenic community size is 802 members. The largest community is at the University of Alabama, which had 6,930 members in the 2017-18 academic year.
- The average campus total following primary recruitment is 113 (538 campuses reporting). University of Alabama and University of Arkansas have the highest campus totals at more than 420.
- The average size of the open house pool is 312 for campuses using RFM (495 reporting).
- The average quota is 32 (491 campuses reporting).
- As reported by campuses in their annual report, the number of campuses participating in fall recruitment is 320, spring recruitment is 120 and second-year recruitment is 10.
- During 2017-18, 63 campuses used an affiliated recruitment counselor program.
- There are 300 College Panhellenics reporting they use an election process for selecting officers, 66 use rotation and 79 use a combination of election and rotation.
- The all-sorority grade point averages were:
 - 3.21 in spring 2017 (above the all-women’s average)
 - 3.21 in fall 2017 (above the all-women’s average)
 - 3.1 in winter 2018 (below the all-women’s average)
- Of the College Panhellenics reporting, 240 reported a total of 1,680,079 hours donated in volunteer service.
- Of the College Panhellenics reporting, 269 reported a total of \$11,148,512 in charitable donations.
- College Panhellenics reported participating in the following NPC initiatives:
 - Month of the Scholar – 148
 - Advisor Appreciation Month – 175
- There were 24 campuses that opened for extension in 2017-18.
