

The National Panhellenic Conference Student Advisory Committee (NPC SAC) helps NPC ensure the college women's perspective is included in our advocacy efforts. The NPC SAC:

- Supports the work of NPC to advance the sorority experience together;
- Represents the collegiate Panhellenic woman's perspective and committee members act as liaisons between college Panhellenic women and NPC; and
- Provides suggestions to the NPC leadership and professional staff on existing campaigns and programs, on ideas for new initiatives and on how to engage their campus communities and Panhellenic women across the U.S. and Canada.

Structure

- The NPC Executive Committee will appoint the NPC SAC and will accept nominations from NPC directors, NPC area advisors and fraternity/sorority advisors.
- NPC SAC applicants will:
 - o Be members in good standing of their NPC member organization.
 - o Be of junior or senior standing with a minimum cumulative GPA of a 3.0.
- NPC SAC committee members are expected to:
 - Serve for one academic year (August to June).
 - o Participate in an introductory onboarding session.
 - Participate (with NPC leadership e and staff) in quarterly conference calls with predetermined agenda topics.
 - o Provide feedback on NPC programming when requested.
 - Provide education about advocacy through communication with College Panhellenic officers.
 - Participate in public relations efforts as appropriate.
 - o Participate in NPC's advocacy efforts (e.g., Capitol Hill visits, other meetings), if requested.

Value of Participation

- Learn a lot! NPC SAC members interact with NPC leadership and professional staff regarding NPC's goals, objectives and strategies for being the premier advocacy and support organization for the advancement of the sorority experience.
- Provide valuable input from the student perspective to ensure the current and future experience for collegiate sorority women is one of value and relevance.
- Be ahead of the game! NPC SAC members are among the first to know about exciting opportunities and challenges, program developments, partnerships and events of NPC.
- Gain firsthand experience working with one of the nation's largest organizations dedicated to serving and benefitting women.

Application Process

- Complete the online application: <u>here</u>.
 - NPC utilizes SmarterSelect so you may save a draft application before submitting.
 - You will be asked to explain why you want to serve on the committee and describe your strengths and/or qualifications for the position. You also must upload a resume.
 - You will need to provide the name of the person who nominated you. NPC will then ask the person for a letter of support.
- Applications and supporting materials are due to the NPC office by April 15.
