



2019-20 Annual Survey Highlights: Fast Facts

Data submitted by National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) member organizations as of June 15, 2020

Membership

Size and scope

- 26 member organizations report a total of 5,494,957 women currently initiated into our organizations. This represents a 2 percent increase from last year.
- 26 member organizations report 375,397 total undergraduates. This represents a 2.5 percent decrease from the last academic year.*
- 26 member organizations report 3,353 chartered and newly establishing collegiate chapters (12 newly establishing chapters representing 10 different member organizations). This is down .3 percent from 3,363 chartered and newly establishing collegiate chapters last year.
 - 15 chapters were chartered by 11 different organizations in 2019-20. This represents a 42.3 percent decrease from the last academic year.
- 26 member organizations report 3,429 alumnae chapters currently.

Retention

- 26 member organizations report 136,327 women were pledged into membership during the 2019-20 academic year.
 - 26 member organizations report 113,095 of those women were initiated.*
- 23 member organizations report 25,982 initiated members resigned from our organizations.
- 23 member organizations report 79,128 collegiate women graduated from college in the 2019-20 academic year.

Scholarships and Financial Assistance

- 22 member organizations report a total of \$7,191,140 in scholarships awarded to members.

Philanthropy and Volunteering

- Total dollars raised for partner philanthropy organizations by alumnae and collegians: \$21,813,397. (7 member organizations reported alumnae statistics and 14 reported collegiate statistics.)
- Total dollars raised for non-partner philanthropy organizations by alumnae and collegians: \$20,926,529. (7 member organizations reported alumnae statistics and 15 reported collegiate statistics.)
- Total hours volunteered overall for philanthropy (partners and non-partners) by alumnae and collegians: 3,286,945. (11 member organizations reported alumnae statistics and 11 reported collegiate statistics.)

*Because of the pandemic, not all new members were initiated in the spring and were deferred to fall 2020. These deferred initiations are a factor in the decline in total undergraduate membership from the last academic year.

Note: Academic success and grade point average (GPA) were not reported this year due to the pandemic's impact on the way colleges/universities reported grades.
